Award-winning author, lecturer and educator Steven Elliott holds a PhD in American Military History from Temple University. His research is focused on the social and administrative history of the Continental Army, and has been recognized by the David Library of the American Revolution, The Fred W. Smith Library at Mount Vernon, the Society of the Cincinnati, the North Jersey Heritage Trail, and the New Jersey Historical Commission.

Dr. Elliott's book, "Surviving the Winters: Housing George Washington's Army and the American Revolution" is set for publication by the University of Oklahoma Press in late 2020. Steven teaches courses on national, local, and military history at Rutgers University-Newark; he has worked as a park guide for the National Park Service at Morristown National Historical Park since 2009.
